Dear Friend of Crime Stoppers,

It's just frustrating. After more than thirty years of serving southeast Michigan as the leading Crime Stoppers organization in the Midwest and the only organization in southeast Michigan that advocates for crime victims and their families, it's just frustrating that the question we hear most is still, "What does Crime Stoppers of Michigan do?" Let me help you with that question.

Imagine you're in a small 12x15 room. Against one wall is a large backdrop with the Crime Stoppers logo and the logos of a dozen corporations that support our work across seven counties of southeast Michigan. In front of that backdrop are a half dozen chairs. Seated on those chairs are family and friends of a human being whose life has been needlessly snuffed out by a heinously criminal act. The family members stare into a television camera, painfully recounting memories of their lost loved one, tearfully sharing their grief, and passionately appealing to "anyone who has information that could lead to an arrest and bring this family some closure" to call the Crime Stoppers 1-800 phone line to speak up.

Now look again. Seated on the laps of the oldest persons sitting on those chairs are children. They say nothing. They don't cry. They have no youthful spark in their eyes. They are the sons and daughters of persons whose lives were taken. They will never again ride on their father's shoulders. Their mothers will never tuck them into bed again. Their lives will never be the same. Will they ever smile again?

Now, imagine standing in the cavernous facility where the Detroit Parade Company warehouses their floats, life-sized bobble heads and other parade paraphernalia. The room reverberates with the gleeful voices of nearly 150 children who are hanging out with Santa and Mrs. Claus, elves, and Crime Stoppers staffers and volunteers who have come together to give these children a reason to smile again.

These children laid flowers at their mother's graves. These children sleep with pictures of their father's under their pillows. They are the same children who sat, sad and motionless at press conferences where other family members pleaded for someone to step up and speak up. And yes. They are smiling again.

They are smiling because the *aftercare* Crime Stoppers provides them and their families is essential for their healing. They are smiling because the work of staff and volunteers to collect, organize, and prepare toys, clothing, and other gifts to be distributed to these children at this event is impactful. They are smiling because the cumulative effects of the resources, encouragement, and coping resources provided during the year through our Family Support groups is potent and significant.

"What does Crime Stoppers of Michigan do?" We put smiles on the faces of children who have experienced immeasurable loss at a tender age. And we cannot keep putting smiles on these children's faces without your financial support. So please, help us as we help the children smile again.

About Crime Stoppers of Michigan

Over the last 30 years, our mission within the seven counties of Southeast Michigan that we serve is to provide an anonymous tip line for the reporting of vital information to help solve crime as well as the delivery of educational safety programs and information through our Center for Crime Prevention.

1-800-Speak-Up

The anonymous tip line has been a valuable tool to over 200 law enforcement agencies in Southeast Michigan. Providing help either to the victim, their family and/or the investigating agency, Crime Stoppers of Michigan reaches out to the public through television, posters, door hangers, press releases and a number of social media platforms. Over the last 30 years, tens of thousands of tips have been received and processed to the appropriate investigative agency. A number of these tips have provided crucial information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person(s) responsible. Tipsters are provided a five digit confidential code to be used in the event a reward is awarded.

Once a case has been "worked" by law enforcement with no resolution, the only option to move it forward is to seek information from the public. Often, Crime Stoppers provides the only viable option left for law enforcement, the victim, and/or their family.







Supporting over 200 federal, state, county and local law enforcement agencies, this program has assisted in the arrest of a number of criminals who prey on the general public making our neighborhoods safer. So far in 2024, because of the arrests made due to tips, \$324,463 of recoveries were reported by law enforcement. This total includes guns taken off the streets, vehicles and cash recovered, and street value of drugs seized.













The Center For Crime Prevention

In addition to working with the public on solving crime, Crime Stoppers of Michigan works with community groups throughout Southeast Michigan providing programs and presentations focused on helping to identify potential crime risks and how to avoid becoming a victim.

The objective of the Center is to promote personal safety through education and resource information that includes topics such as prevention and detection of identity theft, senior scams, and sexual crimes. These articles are separated into subject matter for both students and parents.

The Crime Stoppers' YouTube channel delivers Crime Prevention information through presentations and educational videos to help ensure one's personal safety.

The speaker's bureau provides a variety of subject matter with experts available to neighborhood organizations, students groups, church groups, and community social groups addressing topics that include senior scams, active shooter, neighborhood watch, 1-800-Speak Up, human trafficking, and internet phishing scams.





Presentations also include Crime Stoppers of Michigan interviews on television and radio programs which air in the Southeast Michigan area.

Through the Center, information is shared using brochures and other written information highlighting safe behavior.

The Center for Crime Prevention supports other community based and law enforcement organizations throughout the State of Michigan and provides vital crime prevention information to citizens in Michigan.

A family support program is provided through the Center in partnership with Ascension Open Arms. Victims and/or their families gather together bi-monthly to support each other which includes presentations from mental health professionals providing coping and healing recommendations.

Crime Prevention research continues to be developed to further educate citizens in Southeast Michigan on how best to stay safe.

Crime Stoppers Program is a vital community partnership
